The new initiates were an important factor in the chapter's placing first among the Case fraternities in scholarship with a house average of 2.74. We also retained possession of the division 14 scholarship trophy, the Callender Cup, for another year.

At homecoming Sigma Nu was honored for the second straight year by being awarded the President's Improvement Award. The P.I.A. is presented annually to the most improved fraternity on campus and consists of a \$250 cash award. The brothers plan to use the money for improvements on the house.

A number of brothers have achieved distinction this fall. Jeff Williams was named to the all fraternity football squad. John Cerutti cornered the intramural fraternity league table tennis championship while Mark Frishberg placed fourth in the badminton singles. Sigma Nu's candidate in the Ugly Man on Campus contest, Bob Lattie, was named Ugly Greek. The contest is held annually as part of the Campus Chest charity drive. John Shields has been appointed chairman of the 1968 Case Mock Political Convention. Mike Meier and Tom Thomas will serve as publicity committee co-chairmen for the M.P.C.

Recently the brothers carried out a service project at Alta House on Mayfield Road. Actives and pledges spent Saturday cleaning and repairing parts of the community center.

In place of the Christmas party that has been given at Children's Hospital in past years the chapter will collect money for the Salvation Army on Saturday, December 17.

The chapter has adopted a nine year old Hong Kong girl named Ng Sau Sim under the Foster Parents Plan. We provide financial support for her and receive letters from her periodically.

When Division Commander Don Mosher visited Delta Alpha to review the fraternity's activities recently, the chapter volunteered to host the Divisional meeting this spring. No definite action has been taken on the offer yet.

The chapter recently sponsored an open house for the residents of the Mayfield-Murray Hill area in an effort to improve community relations. The event proved to be a complete success.

This year the Founders' Formal will be held at Owen's Plantation. Music will be provided by the Herb Walker Orchestra. The formal will be on Friday, December 16 from 8 p.m. to 1 a.m. Those alumni interested in attending should contact social chairman Mark Frishberg.
