Dear Delta Alpha Alumnus:

The spring semester of 1967 is proving to be a busy one for Delta Alpha, and a very significant one for future development of the chapter.

During the weekend just prior to the opening of the semester in February, the chapter held a retreat at Gwinn Estates in Bratenahl, Ohio, at which various discussion groups considered the problems of the rush, pledging, and internal chapter policy programs; examined the external image a fraternity should present; and studied the further application of the Way of Honor to Delta Alpha. Perhaps the most important result of this retreat was the expression of the desire to convert from a fining system to a total "honor system" within the chapter. Discussion groups on the topics of "Manpower," "Scholarship," "Honor in Action," "Finances," and "Programming" were led by Delta Alpha alumni Fred Trenor, Kenneth Parker, and William Pritts, and by national Sigma Nu officers.

In intramurals Delta Alpha placed second, third, and fourth in squash and took three first places in swimming. Brothers Frank Steffey, Edward Gesdorf, Ted Weisburch, and Jeff Lund set a school record for the 200 yard freestyle relay (151.4 sec). Brother WRAMVEAL Steffey also lettered in varsity soccer this year.

Looking ahead, Delta Alpha feels honored to have been chosen to send the formal pledging team to the Alpha Sigma Nu Colony at Ashland College on May 5, in preparation for their initiation as a chapter the next evening by Beta Iota chapter, Mt. Union.
