I would like to thank all the brothers who sent in their Reunion Weekend response cards. Your response helps us to get our job done, and makes it a lot easier.



This semester's philanthropy was the MS Walkathon, Almost all the pledges and actives participated either through registration or through walking seven and one-half miles.

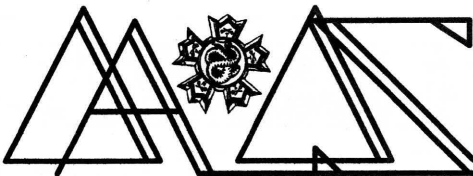
Other spring activities included the Spring Smash, a very successful party which incorporated a band. Many people showed up, including other Greeks.

At 4:00 p.m. at the chapter house, the Ritual Initiation ceremony will take place (coat and tie, initiated brothers only).

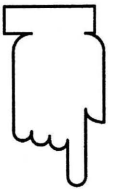
#### **White Rose Formal**
