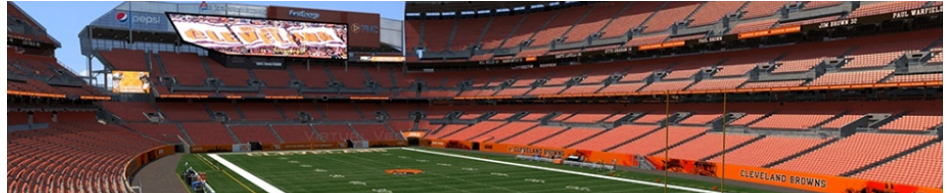

Alumni Scholarships for Collegians

The Delta Alpha - Delta Zeta Alumni Chapter recognizes individual undergraduate members with two scholarships: The Charles Hammond (ΔA 137) and George Bowman (ΔZ 69) Awards. The Alumni Awards Committee presented these awards at the commencement BBQ in May. The Alumni Awards Committee consisted of Joseph Dea (ΔA 1045), Kevin Moeller (ΔA 1291), Dakota Benjamin (ΔA 1324), and Lucas Flowers (ΔA 1352, A 621).

Charles J. Hammond Award

The Charles Jackson Hammond Award is presented to a collegiate Delta Alpha who best exemplifies the ideals of Sigma Nu, as demonstrated by his extraordinary scholastic ability, leadership within Sigma Nu and CWRU, and service to the Cleveland community. Each year, only one collegiate member may receive this distinction, which

comes with a \$1,000 scholarship.

William Oldham (ΔA 1363, A 636) was presented the Hammond Award for his vocal leadership as Commander in 2015, which saw another Rock Chapter Award and strong performance in Pytte Cup. He also served the university community through his work on the Orientation Executive Board and as President of the Interfraternity Council.

George A. Bowman Award

The George Arvene Bowman Award is presented to collegiate members who demonstrate excellence in one of the areas of scholarship, leadership, or service. Up to four Bowman Awards, each with a \$250 scholarship, may be granted each academic year. Four brothers received Bowman Awards in 2017.

Edward Niedoba (ΔA 1378), who completed his two-year term as Treasurer, saw the chapter through continued financial stability and the formation of a functional finance committee, which helped jumpstart the term of his successor.

Colin Budka (ΔA 1402), as Philanthropy Chair and "Nacho Commander" planned the first Super Nacho Friday, the one of the chapter's most successful philanthropy events in recent years. The event—a collaboration with CWRU's Habitat for Humanity Club—included live music by Speakeasy, Solstice, the Case Men's Glee Club, and Sigma Nu jazz musicians. The chapter raised over \$1,200, putting it among the top chapters for philanthropy at CWRU in Fall 2016.

Dallas Eckman (ΔA 1410), as Marshal, led a rethinking of the LEAD Phase I curriculum, as well as a survey on the chapter's mental health through Recovery Resources. The fact that so many candidates initially signed up to serve in focus groups for Recovery Resources showed his positive influence on the chapter's newest members.

Derek Tang (ΔA 1416) led the chapter's service efforts by example, both before and after his successful term as Service Chair. His efforts helped the chapter win Pytte Cup's Excellence in Citizenship for the first time in the 2016-2017 academic year.

Changes to LP1

This calendar year has been a busy one for the candidate process. In my time as Delta Alpha's Marshal, we've focused heavily on reviewing the candidate process and integrating critical feedback from active brothers, the Alumni Advisory Board, and previous Marshals to create a much more fulfilling process for the newest members of our chapter.

This semester, one of the changes I sought to initiate was a systematic review of the candidate class project. Historically, the candidate class project was a requirement of all candidates that sought to create some physical object, event, or educational experience for the chapter or greater CWRU community. Unfortunately, the event has often manifested in laborious work placed on the shoulders of a few members, frustration from older members when projects did not reach completion, and strains on the relationships in the candidate class.

In order to address this, I drafted

a bylaw change to strike the project from the listed requirements for initiation. The chapter voted almost unanimously in favor of the project's removal. It is my belief—and the chapter's, I presume—that the creation of the candidate retreat now accomplishes the positives that the candidate class project in theory provided to the candidate class. The candidate retreat—referred to by some as a miniature brothering retreat—gives candidates an opportunity to bond as a class off-campus with oversight from the Marshal, Chaplain, and other senior members. We engage in team-building activities that lead into vulnerability exercises. This new program has been a shining point of the candidates' experience, and I am very excited to see it grow in the future.

In the future, we hope to see an even more rigorous detail put into the structure and planning of the LEAD Phase I process to maintain a strong program built on the principles of guiding worthy men into our chapter and familiarizing them with our life-long commitment to the values of Love, Truth, and Honor.

Super Nachos
