Delta Alpha Reunites The 1968 ± Reunion

Thirty-one brothers and seventeen guests attended homecoming weekend, October 11 to 14. Delta Alpha Chapter of Sigma Nu was not just well-represented but had more attendees than all other fraternities combined.

The success can be attributed to lots of planning and a strong volunteer committee. Bart Hubbard and Jim Waldorf started planning early in the year, before CWRU had even finalized all the events. The national headquarters of Sigma Nu provided a listing of brothers initiated between 1965 and 1970, but the data had to be scrubbed quite a bit. Bart created a Facebook page, a Google Drive folder, and Gmail account (used like a bulletin board). Jim Waldorf agreed to handle the money, hotel bookings, and event registrations. With the goal of contacting every brother from 1968 and surrounding years, subcommittees were formed:

Signup sheets were used for informal tours of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and the Cleveland Museum of Art.

• Friday was set aside for CWRU events, which included the CAA's Meritorious Service Award presented to Thomas Esselman, Ph.D. (ΔA 686) at the ThinkBox.

• Saturday morning, over a dozen brothers and guests braved the rain and toured Frederick Gearhart's sculpture garden. Others attended the parade, athletic games, and CWRU activities.

• Saturday afternoon, we toured the chapter house and had other "informal activities."

• Saturday evening, we had dinner at Club Isabella and toasted the Chapter Eternal with 50 year-old wine gifted by T-squared (Thomas Thomas).

• Sunday morning, we held a "good-bye breakfast" at the Michelson-Morley Restaurant, with James Paxton, M.D., M.B.A. (ΔA 1082, A 449, Ω 66) presenting chapter history from his book Sigma Nu in Cleveland.

What stands out for me as a memory is the special bond of brotherhood created at Delta Alpha of Sigma Nu. No-one had a dorm reunion! No other fraternities organized as we did. Greek "Week"

Last year, after taking fourth place in Rope Pull; third in Pyramid; and first in Banner, Greek Sing, Coin Wars, Beach Ball Relay Race, and Obstacle Course; Sigma Nu closed out the year-long "Spartan Cup" competition in second place, just a few points behind Delta Chi. A notable high point of the year occurred during the first (and fastest) round of Rope Pull, in which Sigma Nu trenched Sigma Alpha Epsilon in just under two minutes.

Because the name "Spartan Cup" misrepresented the competition as having campus-wide participation, its committee renamed it this year to "Greek Games" to better represent it as a year-long competition for the Greek community. Additionally, with the announcement of the name change came the introduction this year's theme, of "Game Shows." So far this year, Sigma Nu donated more than any other fraternity to the Emergency Dues Fund, tied for third place with Zeta Beta Tau in Banner (behind Beta Theta Pi and Phi Delta Theta), and won second place in Greek Sing in a tragic loss to Delta Upsilon. With strong placements in all three events, Sigma Nu currently holds first place overall and proudly displays the "Greek Games" flag in the living room. Even with Phi Delta Theta returning from their hiatus last year, Sigma Nu remains a strong competitor that looks to continue its success throughout the year.
